GUARDSWELL FARM

Perthshire

Guardswell is one of Scotland's **best known rural wedding and events venues**. As well as venue space for up to 200 guests, the farm hosts up to 30 overnight guests in a range of **eco-friendly accommodation**.

Hosts Anna and Digby Lamotte have been guardians of the **200-acre** Guardswell Farm since 2011. The **farmland is split 50/50 between grass and woodland** and is home to **Shetland cattle, Hebridean sheep, Shropshire sheep, Angora goats, apple trees and a market garden**.

One of the last abandoned villages of Scotland, Pitmiddle village, is located at the top of the farm, with the last person leaving in 1938.

NEWTON FARM HOLIDAYS

Angus

Newton Farm is home to a **thriving farm tour enterprise** with a range of experiences on offer including **Highland Cow safaris and alpaca walking**.

Seasonal lambing events compliment the **year-round tours**. The farm offers **farmhouse bed and breakfast and self-catering accommodation**.

Hosts Graeme and Louise are 8th generation farmers with 4 generations having farmed at Newton of Fotheringham as **tenant farmers** with son Scott also recently moving into the business.

The 500 acre land grow cereals, potatoes and peas and produces **Scotch Beef and Scotch Lamb**.

THE HIDEAWAY EXPERIENCE

Angus

The Hideaway Experience provides **adult only** luxury accommodation in 5 eco-lodges, designed as penthouse suites on the edge of barley fields.

Most guests are staying to celebrate special occasions such as honeymoons and birthdays. Hosts Caroline and Ross Millar have been welcoming guests to the farm for 20 years.

The family farm **1000 acres** across three farms in the Sidlaw Hills in Angus producing **Scotch Beef**, **Scotch Lamb** and cereals including **malting barley**.

Balkello Farm is where the Scottish Agritourism office and team are based.

The Millars will host an evening BBQ for the combined pre-learning journey tour delegates on Sunday 21st June.

CASTLETON FARM SHOP

Aberdeenshire

Castleton Farm Shop and Café is **one of Scotland's most established farm café businesses**, opening in 2004. The farm retail offering and much of the café food is based on the farm's soft fruit harvest complimented by a great variety of locally farmed produce.

Anna Mitchell leads on the agritourism and farm retail business while husband Ross manages one of **Scotland's largest and most northerly soft fruit farms**.

Castleton Farm extends to **1200 acres** of arable and soft and stone fruit. The farm also grows arable crops, cut flowers, flax for fibre and manages woodland. **Biomass and renewable energy production** provides heated greenhouses and helps to manage electricity costs. **Over 550 employees** from all over the world work on the farm and many are housed on site.

WESTERTON FARM

Aberdeenshire

Also on Angus Glens & Mearns Core Tour

Includes a whisky tasting with Fettercairn Distillery.

Westerton Farm began farm retail in 2017 with a small, **honesty-based hut**, “**The Spud Hut**”. In April 2021 a larger farm shop opened selling a wider range of farm produce and local food and drink.

The agritourism offering includes **retail**, a small **farm café**, **events**, “**feast nights**” **showcasing** **Aberdeenshire produce** and an annual **pumpkin festival**. Westerton is **one of Scotland’s four Agritourism Monitor Farms**.

Hosts, father and daughter David Gammie and Fiona Smith, grow a range of fresh **vegetables and cereals** on the **400-acre** farm. Visitors to the farm can “**pick your own**” **vegetables** all year round, including pick your own “tatties”. Fiona’s husband Doug farms next door producing **Scotch Beef** sold in the farm shop and enjoyed during feast nights.

350 acres of spring barley grow each year at Westerton Farm. A proportion travels just **five miles to Fettercairn Distillery** (founded 1824), to be crafted into a **sought-after single malt whisky**.

Delegates will enjoy an engaging talk on the **whisky making process** and learn about the distillery’s long-term commitment to source **barley exclusively from farmers within a 50-mile radius**, before a **guided tasting of the Fettercairn single malt**.



PORT OF ABERDEEN

Aberdeenshire

Northlink Ferries connect Aberdeen and the Scottish mainland with the islands of Orkney and Shetland.

This includes **handling many thousands of sheep, cows, horses and other livestock through Aberdeen Harbour each year.**

Alan Cumming who is in charge of the livestock lairage has years' worth of experience and many stories to share about this interesting part of Scotland's farming story.

This last stop of the tour in Aberdeen will give **a unique insight into island life and the logistics of transporting stock from the islands to mainland Scotland and back.**
